## Town of Geddes Pavilion Reservations

**(MEMORIAL DAY WEEKEND TO COLUMBUS DAY WEEKEND)**

The Town of Geddes Department of Parks and Recreation began accepting reservations for the use of the pavilion at Lakeland Park and Lindbergh Lawns Park on January 2, 2014.

Lakeland Park is located on Alhan Parkway, just off State Fair Blvd. The facilities available at Lakeland Park include a pavilion/electricity, restrooms, playground equipment, playing fields, tennis and basketball courts.

Lindbergh Lawns Park is located on Bennett Ave, just off Longbranch Road. The facilities available include a small pavilion, restrooms, playground equipment, and half-court basketball.

Groups or organizations reserving the pavilions understand that they are entitled to exclusive use of the pavilion, but not of all the other park facilities. They are still open to the public.

Those wishing to reserve the pavilion must be **Town of Geddes Residents** and a **\$20.00 user fee** will be charged. For reservations, call the Department of Parks and Recreation at **487-8238**.

## TOWN OF GEDDES PARK REGULATIONS & POLICIES

In order to **help keep our parks clean, safe and usable by all**, Local Law 8 of the year 2001, entitled "Park Regulations" was enacted to govern park use in the Town of Geddes. The law in its entirety can found in the Town of Geddes Code Book – Chapter 143.

Some of the regulations adopted are listed below:

- Park Hours:       **Sunrise to Sunset**
- Pavilion Use:     **Memorial Weekend to Mid-October**

- Facilities and areas in the park shall be used only for the purposes designated or implicit in their character.
- No person shall carry into and/or have possession of any **glass** beverage containers.
- It shall be unlawful to bring or cause to be brought any animal into any park, recreation or playground area, except for trained guide dogs for the blind which are expressly exempt from all provisions of the chapter.
- Fires may not be built or allowed anywhere in park or playground areas except in stoves, fireplaces, or designated areas provided for that purpose.
- Licensed motor vehicles shall be permitted only on designated roadways, and vehicles shall be parked in areas of places so provided and designated. Motor scooters, motorcycles, minibikes, go-carts, and snowmobiles shall not be permitted.
- Commit any act which is defined as criminal conduct under the New York State Penal Law.
- Any conduct which constitutes a violation of this chapter will be a violation, punishable by up to fifteen (15) days in jail and/or a fine of up to \$250.00. Each such violation shall constitute a separate violation punishable under this section.

**HELP KEEP OUR PARKS CLEAN AND SAFE**, if you see anyone misusing the park - please let us know. To report any problems, etc. call the Geddes Police or the Geddes Recreation Department.

**\*\*The Town of Geddes supports the county's no smoking initiative in public parks by adopting a "no smoking" policy in town parks. The enforcement of this policy is through voluntary compliance.**

# NEWS FROM THE DEPARTMENTS:

## From the Highway Department:

Ronald Chester, Highway Superintendent

### Services performed by the Town of Geddes Highway Dept.

1. **BRUSH and YARD WASTE PICK-UP SCHEDULE (NO GRASS CLIPPINGS)** (Mulching is a better alternative)

**Monday** – Lakeland area (Including Linbergh Lawns)

**Thursday** – W. Genesee St., Wilshire Rd., Wynthrop Rd., Hatherleigh Rd., Chaumont Dr., Century Dr., Southview Rd., N.Terry Rd., Timberwolf Circle, Copliegh Dr., Kenyon Dr., Westlind Rd., Westfall Dr., Stanley Dr., Clearview Dr., Horseshoe Dr., Duchess La., Watchtower La., Blackstone Wy., W. Granger Rd. from S.Terry Rd to town line, Limestone La., Treeland Circle, Crabapple La., Blueberry La., Pumpkin La., Spructree La., Kimberly Dr.

**Fridays** – Westvale area (Westholm Blvd. section to Avery Ave., City Line)

All yard waste, other than tree branches, must be in paper bags, cardboard boxes, trash cans. (**NO PLASTIC BAGS**). Loose raked leaves in wind rows along the roadway will only be picked up from October 1<sup>st</sup> through Dec. 1<sup>st</sup>. All other times of the year, rakings must be in paper bags, cardboard boxes, or trash cans. (**NO BLUE BINS**).

2. **BULK ITEM PICK-UP SCHEDULE** –Picked up same day as garbage and recycling. Bulk items are – Furniture, mattresses, clothing, large plastic toys, etc. **No full house clean outs.**

3. **CONSTRUCTION DEBRIS WILL NO LONGER BE PICKED UP CURBSIDE BY THE HIGHWAY DEPT.**

The Town of Geddes Highway Dept. has modified its curbside services as of January 1<sup>st</sup>, 2012. These modifications are a direct result of lost revenue to the town, a reduction of employees, along with cutting out the summer help work program in our Highway Dept.

Our Highway Dept. will no longer pick up construction debris put out to the curb. Town of Geddes residents can drop off this material in our Transfer Station at 654 S. Terry Road, across from the Highway Garage Monday through Friday from 7:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. at no charge.

Items that are considered construction debris are as follows: any wood products, roofing, toilets, sinks, bathtubs, insulation, wiring, vanities, cabinets, counter tops, flooring, fencing, windows, sliding glass doors, interior and exterior doors, siding (wood, vinyl, aluminum, etc.).

Small amounts (a wheelbarrow full) of concrete, stones, dirt, blacktop, blocks, bricks, will be picked up the second week of the month, April through October. Please call and be put on the list for pick up.

These changes have the full support of the Town Board and were discussed during the budget hearings in September 2011.

Thank you in advance for your cooperation in help keeping our Town clean. Any questions call 488-7705.

4. **WHITE GOODS PICK-UP** - Picked up same day as brush and yard waste. White good items are – Stoves, dishwashers, clothes dryers, washing machines, hot water tanks, small amounts of scrap metal, etc.

5. **CONCRETE, STONES, DIRT, ETC.** - A wheelbarrow full (approx. 4 cu. ft.) will be picked up once a month from April 1<sup>st</sup> through November 1<sup>st</sup>. Residents must call Highway Garage Department and be placed on list. (488-7705)

The following items **WILL NOT BE PICKED UP BY OUR DEPT.**

Tires, gas tanks, l.p. tanks, car parts, refrigerators, freezers, air conditioners, dehumidifiers, microwaves, t.v.'s computer monitors, construction debris.

Please note: Only wind damage and Christmas Trees will be picked up curbside from December 1<sup>st</sup> to April 1<sup>st</sup>. Due to weather conditions, all other curbside pick-ups must be called in to the Town of Geddes Highway Dept. at 488-7705 between 7:00 a.m. to 3:30 p.m., Monday through Friday at this time of year.

### GARBAGE

Syracuse Haulers Waste Removal is the **garbage/trash hauler** for the Town. If you have any garbage/trash questions, please call Syracuse Haulers at **426-6771** from 6:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m on weekdays

1. Do **NOT** put garbage out any earlier than the night before.

2. All garbage must be at **curbside** by **6:00 a.m.** on collection day.

3. The weekly limit on household trash is a total of 10 trash bags and not weighing more than 75lbs. each

4. Please use **clear** trash/garbage bags.

5. **NOT** included in your trash pick-up is: construction debris, yard waste, furniture, appliances, and anything hazardous.

6. Sign-up to receive email notices of 1-day delays in collection due to holidays, along with details on other services offered, by visiting the website, [www.syracusehaulers.com](http://www.syracusehaulers.com).

### RECYCLING

Waste Management is the **recycling hauler** for the Town. If you have any recycling questions, please call Waste Management at **457-5838 ex. 302**.

1. Do **NOT** put recycling out any earlier than the night before.

2. All recycling must be at **curbside** by **7:00 a.m.**

#### RECYCLING INFO

(Information obtained from Onondaga County Resource Recovery Agency)

### Softcover books and #5 plastics accepted in the blue bin!

• Softcover books are any bound item that is NOT a hardcover book. Think paperbacks, phone books, manuals, workbooks, notebooks, etc. There is no special preparation necessary if the softcover book's binding is stapled or glued. Just toss it into your blue bin. If it has a spiral, wire or plastic binding those must be removed

before you can toss the soft-cover and its contents into your bin.

• #5s are wide-mouthed, tub shaped plastic containers that typically hold yogurt, margarine, cottage cheese, etc. Check the bottom for a #5 symbol to be sure.

### What goes in the trash?

#### Trash this Paper:

- Corrugated cardboard with wax, plastic, or styrofoam
- Frozen food boxes
- Paper plates & cups
- Paper towels, tissue, toilet paper
- Egg cartons (paper or styrofoam)
- Non-paper envelopes (Tyvek)
- Hardcover books
- Metallic paper (including cards with silver / gold trimming)

#### Trash this Plastic:

- Plastic food trays (frozen food trays, candy trays, cake, cookie containers)
- Styrofoam (coffee cups, packaging materials, trays)
- Hard plastics (tableware, toys)
- Motor oil bottles (or any bottle that contained a hazardous material)
- Plastic bags (NOTE: CLEAN plastic bags can be recycled at most grocery and retail stores)

#### Trash this Glass:

- Dishes & drinking glasses
- Ceramics (plates or mugs)
- Window & auto glass
- Mirrors
- Pottery & clay pots
- Light bulbs

- **Fluorescent bulbs: Please do not place in the trash or Blue Bin.**

- RESIDENTS should make an appointment for OCRRA's next Household Hazardous Waste Day.

- BUSINESSES should follow NY state requirements, see the DEC website for info. Search under "fluorescent bulbs".

#### Trash this Metal:

- Latex paint cans (dry out paint and remove lids)
- To dispose of oil based paints, stains, and varnishes make an appointment for OCRRA's next Household Hazardous Waste Collection Day.
- Scrap metal. Take to a scrap dealer.

 Newspapers, Magazines, Catalogs and Softcover Books <small>Keep loose, don't tie.</small>	 Cardboard, pizza, pasta and cereal boxes <small>Flatten.</small>
 Papers, Mail, Envelopes	 #1 and #2 Plastic BOTTLES* <small>Empty and rinse, no lids.</small>
 Cans and Jars <small>Empty and rinse out food residue, labels are okay.</small>	 #5 Plastic Tubs <small>Empty and rinse, no lids.</small>

\* While there are #1 and #2 food containers, ONLY #1 and #2 BOTTLES are recyclable. Bottles have necks and smaller tops than bottoms. Can't read the numbers on the bottom? Most bottles are #1 or #2--so if it is a plastic BOTTLE, recycle it!

The Town of Geddes Police Department recently created a Police Tips email address to be used by citizens who would like to advise the police department of a police related issue or provide information on criminal activity. The information received can only be accessed by the police investigator and myself, and the source is kept confidential.

As summer approaches, people have the tendency to drive faster. Traffic enforcement is one of our top priorities and we are committed to having safe roads. Our traffic programs are conducted on an on going basis, however, if you have a specific area that you feel needs attention, please call the Geddes Police at 468-3283 or send a message to the Police Tips email address.

Our speed display signs will again be deployed to areas of the Town where speeding has been an issue. The signs have become a very popular traffic enforcement tool that are being used in many neighborhoods. We will continue to hand out the "SLOW DOWN" lawn signs that have become a big hit with local residents. You can receive a lawn sign by stopping by the Geddes Police Department during business hours.

The Geddes Police will again be participating in the state wide "Click It Or Ticket" campaign this year. The campaign will commence on May 19, 2014 and continue until June 1, 2014. Our goal is to increase seat belt usage in an effort to reduce serious injury or death from traffic accidents. For your safety, as well as others, please use your seat belts.

## From the Assessor's Office:

### EXEMPTIONS

Please be advised, the Assessor's office has completed the processing of all applications for exemptions, including but not limited to, the Basic STAR, Enhanced STAR, Senior Citizens with Limited Income, Persons with Disabilities and Limited Income, Veterans, Volunteer Firefighters and Volunteer Ambulance Workers, Business and Clergy Members.

If you feel you may be eligible for any exemptions you must file an application with the Assessor's office by March 1<sup>st</sup> to affect the following September school bill, January property bill and May Village bill.

The Town of Geddes Assessor's Office, as a courtesy, will mail out all renewal applications for exemptions in September 2014. When applying for the Enhanced Star exemption please provide a copy of your Federal Income Tax return for 2013 with the completed application. When applying for the Senior Citizen with Limited Income exemption please provide a copy of your MOST RECENT Federal Income Tax (2013 or 2014) with the completed application and the end of the year Social Security Benefit Statement. The Basic Star Exemp-

tion needs to be filed by all new owner occupied residents. Any owner, who presently receives the Basic Star, turning 65 by December 2015, may be eligible for the Enhanced Star. All applications for exemptions must be filed by MARCH 1, 2015.

### GRIEVANCE

Grievance Day is always the fourth Tuesday in May. This year Grievance Day will be on Tuesday, May 27<sup>th</sup> from 4pm to 8 pm. Applications will be available the first week in May at the Assessor's office. Once an application is submitted to our office you will be given a time to appear in front of the Board of Review, to present your complaint. The tentative assessment roll is available for review in the Assessor's office.

I would like to thank those who exhibited kindness and understanding during these busy times.

## From the desk of the Dog Control Officer:

Summer is here, and the time for certain doggy problems is once again upon us.

I should first address the barking issue, as I have been hearing quite a bit of noise regarding this problem.

It seems as though in many of these cases the dog owner is unaware that there is a problem. Some dog owners will leave the dog outside, all day, unattended, while they are away at work, school or wherever. The dog is ok when they leave and remains this way for awhile, but soon becomes bored, and now begins to bark, at anything, and everything, and in some cases they bark at nothing at all. Not being home, these dog owners do not know this is going on. As, for the sleeping neighbor that works nights, or the one that wants to sit outside and enjoy a summer day with peace and quiet, or maybe do a little yard work, this dog is a major disruption, and in most cases is not tolerated for very long. Please for the sake of good neighbor etiquette, take a minute to talk to each other. Make sure your dog is not bothering anyone, with its excessive barking. Or, if you are not the owner, but the neighbor being annoyed, make an effort to alert the dog owner and let them know that this annoyance is going on. If you have made the attempt and have met with negative results, you should contact our office immediately to advise us of the problem, so we can defuse the situation early, and avoid an explosive neighbor dispute.

Doggy problem number 2, is just that; # 2 ! There seems to be a pattern with certain dog walkers that allow their dogs to do their job on other peoples property. Some dog walkers believe that because they are obeying the leash law, they can let their dog go wherever and whenever it needs to. This is not a good idea! In fact it's a really bad idea!!

This practice really annoys home owners, and infuriates those that do not own dogs. Dog walkers should carry a small bag with them and pick up whatever doggy drops on the street or curbside. Take it home and put it in your


trash. Your dog, your doo!

In fact I would like to impose a new campaign to be called POOPY - Which stands for - Paws Off Other Peoples Yards. Walk your dogs in the street, pick up after they do their job, so the next time you walk that path, you don't step in your own doo - and don't let doggy go number one on the yards either, dog urine burns the grass and invites other dogs to do the same. Be a good dog owner, a good neighbor and a nice person, curb your dog and remember POOPY ! Paws Off Other Peoples Yards!!

In addition to all of this, please comply with the Town of Geddes Leash Law at all times. License your dog at 4 months of age - remember to have your dog vaccinated against rabies, prior to obtaining the license as required. ## From the Code Enforcement/ Fire Marshall's Office:

Peter Albrigo, Code Enforcement Officer

Summers finally here and we like to give you a short reminder about outdoor burning.

The State Fire Code regulates outdoor burning; a few regulations that may help enjoy a safe quiet recreational fire without disturbing the neighbors.

1) At no time may rubbish or debris be used as a fuel source. **No burning garbage!**

2) The fuel source shall be no larger than 3' Dia. & no higher than 2'

3) Minimum distance from a structure is 25'

4) If it is approved fire pit it may be 15' from a structure

5) Open burning shall not be offensive or objectionable due to smoke or emissions to your neighbors. At times

State and County emergency management organizations may determine that local conditions may prohibit any outdoor burning.

6) All fires should be constantly attended until the fire has been extinguished. There must be a proper method of extinguishing the fire for immediate utilization.

7) USE COMMON SENSE! Be polite and respect your neighbors'.

The local Fire or Police Departments may request you to extinguish your fire if any of these rules are not complied with.





Get out and Stay Out. CALL 911! But do it once your're out from a neighbors or your cell phone. Being overcome by smoke can happen very quickly. If you feel heat or experience smoke stay low and go, on your hands and knees not on your belly. Make sure you have working smoke detectors and realize you only have about 2 minutes to get out if one is sounding in a fire situation. If you haven't tested your smoke detector do so, vacuum it and change the battery. If the

detector is over 10 years old replace it and write the date you purchased them on the detector. (Carbon Monoxide Detectors only last about 5 years). The Solvay Fire Department is a 100% Volunteer Fire Department and we are always looking for members. If you are interested in becoming a volunteer please call 468-1710. Help us help our community.
