Town of Geddes Pavilion Reservations

(Memorial Weekend to Columbus Day Weekend)

The Town of Geddes Department of Parks and Recreation began accepting reservations for the use of the pavilion at Lakeland Park and Lindbergh Lawns Park on January 3, 2022.

Lakeland Park is located on Alhan Parkway, just off State Fair Blvd. The facilities available at Lakeland Park include a pavilion/electricity, restrooms, playground equipment, playing fields, tennis and basketball courts.

Lindbergh Lawns Park is located on Bennett Ave, just off Longbranch Road. The facilities available include a small pavilion, restrooms, playground equipment, and half-

Groups or organizations reserving the pavilions understand that they are entitled to exclusive use of the pavilion, but not of all the other park facilities. They are still open to the public.

Those wishing to reserve the pavilion must be Town of Geddes Residents and a \$40.00 user fee will be charged. For reservations, call the Department of Parks and Recreation at 315 487-8238.

Town of Geddes Park Regulations & Policies

In order to help keep our parks clean, safe and usable by all, Local Law 8 of the year 2001, entitled "Park Regulations" was enacted to govern park use in the Town of

The law in its entirety can found in the Town of Geddes Code Book – Chapter 143. Some of the regulations adopted are listed below:

Park Hours: Sunrise to Sunset

Pavilion Use: Memorial Weekend to Mid-October

Facilities and areas in the park shall be used only for the purposes designated or implicit in their character.

No person shall carry into and/or have possession of any glass beverage containers. It shall be unlawful to bring or cause to be brought any animal into any park,

recreation or playground area, except for trained guide dogs for the blind which are expressly exempt from all provisions of the chapter.

Fires may not be built or allowed anywhere in park or playground areas except in stoves, fireplaces, or designated areas provided for that purpose.

Licensed motor vehicles shall be permitted only on designated roadways, and vehicles shall be parked in areas of places so provided and designated. Motor scooters, motorcycles, minibikes, go-carts, and snowmobiles shall not be

not be permitted. Commit any act which is defined as criminal conduct under the New York State

Any conduct which constitutes a violation of this chapter will be a violation,

punishable by up to fifteen (15) days in jail and/or a fine of up to \$250.00. Each such violation shall constitute a separate violation punishable under this

HELP KEEP OUR PARKS CLEAN AND SAFE, if you see anyone misusing the park - please let us know. To report any problems, etc. call the Geddes Police or

the Geddes Recreation Department. **Also the Town supports the county's initiative in public parks by adopting a "no smoking" policy in town parks. The enforcement of this policy is through voluntary compliance.

Holiday Schedule - 2022 for Garbage and Recycling Pick ups

Garbage and Recycling will not be picked up on the following holidays:

The garbage and recycling pick ups on these days will be a day late. If the Holiday falls on a Wednesday only Wednesday and Thursday's route will be affected. Addendum - if holiday falls on the weekend, the regular Monday-Friday schedule will prevail.

Curbside pickup of **YARD WASTE**, **GARBAGE**, **CONSTRUCTION DEBRIS & OTHER REFUSE** is for the benefit of Geddes residents. There should be no drop-offs from non-residents to residences located in the Town of Geddes.

**Services performed by the Town of Geddes Highway Dept. are for residents doing the work themselves at their homes.

**Any contractor doing remodeling or repairs on a Town residence is responsible for the disposal of any debris from the remodeling/repairs.

1. BRUSH and YARD WASTE PICK-UP SCHEDULE

Monday - Lakeland area (Including Linbergh Lawns)

Thursday – W.Genesee St., Wilshire Rd., Wynthrop Rd., Hatherleigh Rd., Chaumont Dr., Century Dr., Southview Rd., N.Terry Rd., Timberwolf Circle, Copliegh Dr., Kenyon Dr., Westlind Rd., Westfall Dr., Stanley Dr., Clearview Dr., Horseshoe Dr., Duchess La., Watchtower La., Blackstone Wy., W. Fridays – Westvale area (Westholm Blvd. section to Avery Ave., City Line) – (subject to change due to pick up volume and weather)

Grass Clippings will be picked up during regular yard waste days from April 1st through December 1st as is the current schedule. All grass clippings MUST BE in PAPER BAGS, CARDBOARD BOXES or a container NOT TO EXCEED 50 lbs. <u>ABSOLUTELY NO PLASTIC BAGS!</u> (Mulching is a better alternative)

All yard waste, other than tree branches, must be in paper bags, cardboard boxes, trash cans. (NO PLAS-TIC BAGS) – there is a 50 lb limit for barrels and bags

Loose raked leaves in wind rows along your front yard (**do not put in roadway**) will only be picked up from October 1st through Dec. 1st. All other times of the year, rakings must be in paper bags, cardboard boxes,or trash cans. (NO BLUE BINS).

2. BULK ITEM PICK-UP SCHEDULE

Picked up day after garbage and recycling, except Lakeland and Lindbergh Lawns which will be picked up on Monday.

Bulk items include: Furniture (NOT including mattresses/boxsprings), clothing, large plastic toys, etc. ** No full house clean outs

3. **CONSTRUCTION DEBRIS**

Picked up day after garbage and recycling, except Lakeland and Lindbergh Lawns which will be picked up on Monday.

No more that 3 cubic yards at one time (equal to a pickup truck full), year round with weather permitting.

Construction debris is: toilets, sinks, bathtubs, shower doors, cabinets, countertops, sheet rock, wood, doors (wood & metal), windows, siding, paneling, insulation, roofing, plywood and electrical.

Curbside Recycling Newspapers, magazines, Cardboard, pizza, Papers, mail, catalogs and softcover books pasta, cereal boxes, etc. envelopes Keep loose. Don't tie Milk and juice cartons Plastic bottles and jugs Plastic dairy tubs Cans and jars Empty and rinse; no lids Empty and rinse Empty and replace cap Empty and rinse. Labels are ok

No fluorescent fixtures.

4. WHITE GOODS PICK-UP -

Picked up same day as brush and yard waste.

White good items are – Stoves, dishwashers, clothes dryers, washing machines, hot watertanks, small amounts of scrap metal, etc.

5. CONCRETE, STONES, DIRT, ETC.

A wheelbarrow full (approx. 4 cu. ft.) will be picked up once a month from April 1st through November 1st. Residents must call Highway Garage Department and be placed on list (488-7705)

The following items WILL NOT BE PICKED UP BY OUR DEPT.

Tires, gas tanks, l.p. tanks, car parts, refrigerators, freezers, air conditioners, dehumidifiers, microwaves, t.v.'s computer monitors, mattresses and box springs.

The Highway Department does not accept electronics. Please visit **ocrra.org** for recycling options.

Please note: Only wind damage and Christmas Trees will be picked up curbside from December 1st to April 1st.

Please do not leave any construction debris, bulk items or yard waste in front of the salt barn or in the parking lots at any time.

GARBAGE

From the Code Enforcement / Fire Marshall's Office:

Check with our office or the Town website on what projects require a Building Permit. Replacing existing fences, sheds, decks/porches, etc. all require Building Permits. Zoning Code & Building Codes change over the years and the new codes must be met. Projects that get overlooked as requiring a Building Permit is basement remodeling and turning garages to habitable spaces. Basements and garages are designed as utility/storage spaces. Turning them into habitable spaces requires a Building Permit for code compliance to be met. The main concern is the secondary means of egress out of the basement must be met. When N.Y.S. adopted the current 2020 Residential Building Code, all new houses were required to have this secondary means already installed to make the conversion easier, but still requiring a Building Permit when done.

Here are some reminders for the season: We will address all written complaints submitted to our office. Complaints are kept confidential and the forms are available on our website or in our office. Basketball hoops should not be set up and left in the road right-ofway, it is very dangerous to have them there. Recreational fire pits are allowed, but all regulations need to be complied with, including most importantly that it is cleaned seasoned wood that is burned. The same you would use in an indoor fireplace.

Solvay Fire Service Award Program

In late November 2021, residents voted on a referendum for the Solvay Fire Department Service Awards increasing its allocation from \$480 to \$1,200. The Service Awards program is a Defined Contribution Service Award Program, for active volunteer firefighter members of the Solvay Fire Department. The Program is administered by the Solvay Fire Department and the Town of Geddes and will now provide an active volunteer firefighter member of the Solvay Fire Department earning the award paid by the Town of Geddes for each calendar year during which the volunteer firefighter earns 50 or more points under the Solvay Fire Department Ser-

vice Award Program Point System. The Service Award Program provides that the entitlement age is 55 years of age, that participants obtain a nonforfeitable right to a service award after five (5) years of accredited service, and that activities for which points shall be granted towards a year of accredited service are listed in the Service Award Point Documentation provided to each participant, and include participation in Training Courses, Drills, Sleep-in or Stand By duty, work in elected or appointed positions within the Department, attendance at meetings, Department Responses, Inspections, Fire Prevention activities.

EXEMPTIONS

Please be advised, the Assessor's office has completed the processing of all applications for exemptions, including but not limited to, the Basic STAR, Enhanced STAR, Senior Citizens with Limited Income, Persons with Disabilities and Limited Income, Veterans, Volunteer Firefighters and Volunteer Ambulance Workers, Business and Clergy Members.

If you feel you may be eligible for any exemptions you must file an application with the Assessor's office by **March 1**st to affect the following September School bill, January Property bill and May Village bill.

The Town of Geddes Assessor's Office, as a courtesy, will mail out all renewal applications for exemptions in September 2022. When applying for the Enhanced Star exemption, please provide a copy of your Federal Income Tax return for 2021 with the completed application. When applying for the Senior Citizen with Limited Income exemption please provide a copy of your 2021 Federal Income Tax (or any end of year statements) with the completed application and the end of the year Social Security Benefit Statement. Any owner, who presently receives the Basic Star, turning 65 by December 2023, may be eligible for the Enhanced Star. All applications for exemptions must be filed by our annual taxable status date, MARCH 1st.

There have been some changes to the STAR Exemption Program. If you are a new owner or do not already have a STAR Exemption on your primary residence, you may qualify for a STAR Relief Check. To apply, you will need to

contact New York State Department of Taxation and Finance at (518) 457-2036 OR register online at WWW.TAX.NY.GOV/STAR and click on "Register for Star" and follow the instructions.

Also, if you have missed the March 1st deadline for filing for the Enhanced STAR program, you can file a good cause RP-425-GC with New York State or contact them directly at the number above.
